



Information on the processing of personal data in the context of the OpenBikeSim research project at the Chair of Bicycle Traffic at the University of Wuppertal.

(Version 1.0 from 05.05.2023)

With this data protection information, the University of Wuppertal (BUW) fulfils its duty to inform in accordance with Article 13 of the EU Data Protection Regulation (EU-GDPR) for the above-mentioned processing of personal data.

2. personal data processed and purposes

In the course of data collection for the OpenBikeSim research project, personal data will be collected from you and processed for the following purposes:

For the organisation of the individual interviews

• Contact details: name, e-mail address, telephone number, time of the individual interview.

The following data is collected and processed for the research work to analyse requirements for the OpenBikeSim online portal:

Interview:

- Professional position
- Knowledge and experience in relation to the development and use of bicycling simulators
- Knowledge and experience of the development and use of community-driven open-source online portals
- Requirements for the OpenBikeSim portal, the information provided there and the cooperation in the OpenBikeSim community with regard to good usability and attractiveness

3. Legal Basis

The processing of personal data, which takes place when contacting potential participants, serves to prepare further research. The legal basis is §17 paragraph 1 DSG NRW.

The processing of personal data collected during the interviews and measurements of the experiments is carried out with the consent of the persons concerned in accordance with Art. 6 Para. 1 lit. a. EU-GDPR

The processing of the personal data of the employees in the research project takes place based on the employment relationship in accordance with §18 Paragraph 1 DSG NRW.

4. Data Transfers

As a matter of principle, we do not transfer your personal data processed by BUW for the purposes mentioned under 2 to third parties.

If technical service providers are given access to personal data, this is done based on a contract in accordance with Art. 28 EU-GDPR.

5. Duration of Processing / Data Deletion

Personal data processed for the organisation of the interviews and collected during the interviews will be deleted 3 months after the end of the research project or - if the data are in the form of paper documents - destroyed. The project is expected to be completed in February 2026. The collected data will be anonymized at the latest 3 months after the end of the project and will only be stored for further research purposes in a form that no longer has any personal reference.

6. Your Rights as a Data Subject

a data subject, you can assert the rights granted to you by the EU GDPR at any time:



- the right to be informed whether and which of your data is being processed (Art. 15 EU-GDPR),
- the right to request that the data concerning you be corrected or completed (Art. 16 EU-GDPR),
- the right to have data concerning you deleted in accordance with Art. 17 EU-GDPR,
- the right to demand restriction of the processing of the data in accordance with Art. 18 EU-GDPR,
- the right to revoke your consent at any time. This does not affect the lawfulness of the processing carried out on the basis of the consent until revocation (Art. 7 (3) EU GDPR),
- the right to object to future processing of data relating to you in accordance with Art. 21 EU-GDPR.

In addition to the above-mentioned rights, you have the right to lodge a complaint with the supervisory authority for data protection (Art. 77 EU-GDPR), for example with the competent authority for the university:
